Please contact the City of New Bedford Department of Public Infrastructure at (508) 979-1550 etx. 4 to notify DPI staff that final sidewalk and/or roadway trench repairs within the City's Right of Way have been completed. All final trench repairs including, but not limited to, bituminous concrete patches, cement concrete sidewalk repairs and disturbed grass and/or landscaped areas must be inspected and approved by a DPI Field Engineer.

As a Bonded Contractor, you must maintain the integrity of all final trench repairs for two years. Therefore, final trench repairs must be inspected at the time of installation for an accurate record of install date and completion of final warranty period. DPI monitors permits and the warranty period; failure to contact DPI within 30 days from completion of work (or other work resulting in the disturbance of City owned Right of Way), may be subject to a fee or rejection of future permits.

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
