In addition, a valid Industrial User Discharge Permit issued by the City, and a valid Permit for Sewer System Extension or Connection issued by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, Division of Water Pollution Control, shall be required for applicants wishing to discharge industrial wastes to the City's sewer system.

TERMS

a) Type of Pipe Required: PVC SDR-35

b) Separate Sanitary and Storm connections are required where a 2 - pipe system exists in the street.

c) All work must be inspected and approved by a D.P.W. Inspector, both in the street and on private property, before backfilling.

d) A Filing and Inspection Fee of \$ 50.00, plus an Entrance Fee of \$ where applicable, must accompany this application.

e) Other requirements: Storm Drain Connection only -
K.R. Rezendes to do all work

Applicant agrees to abide by the above terms, as well as all pertinent ordinances of the City of New Bedford, and such other special rules as the Commissioner of Public Works may deem necessary.

Dear Mr. LaMarche:

The New Bedford School Department recently contracted with K.R. Rezendes, Inc. Construction Company to install a new catch basin and storm drain service to carry surface water from the west side of the Ottiwell School property to the City surface drain in Earle Street.

It has always been a requirement of the Department of Public Works that all such services, connecting to either the sewer or surface drain systems or both, be inspected by a D.P.W. inspector for approval prior to backfilling. This requirement is stated on the face of the permit secured by the School Department for the work, as well as in the specs supplied to the contractor by the D.P.W. Additionally, in this particular instance, Mr. Rezendes was personally reminded by our engineer to arrange in advance for the said inspection.

Despite all of this, it appears that the work was completed without any inspection or notice being given to the D.P.W. It is our understanding that Mr. Tony Braz of your department gave oral permission for the contractor to cover the work. As a result, we have no as-built inspector's sketch, nor any verifiable information regarding pipe bedding, slope, alignment, or main connection data.

Unfortunately, this is not the first instance of such violation involving a School Department installation. The D.P.W. cannot expect contractors to re-dig uninspected work involving private owners, while allowing the same contractors to "Get Away" unsupervised where another City department is concerned.

This Department is attempting to obtain the required information without re-excavating the service. However, should a dig-up be necessary, the School Department will be expected to arrange same at its own expense. Should there be any future occurrences of this nature, re-excavation will automatically be required.
